SHOPPING & RESTAURANTS

Newmarket is true to its name with an abundance of shopping opportunities from brand name stores at 996,183 sq.ft. Upper Canada Mall; everyday shopping at Yonge Street & Davis Drive as well as the 404 Town Centre; to quaint boutiques in charming historic Main Street.

Foodies will discover an assortment of eateries, pubs, contemporary and fine dining, clustered in two spots; along Yonge Street and nestled in the historic Main Street enclave, one to the west and the other just a few blocks east of The Davis. These are just a very few, but let your own tastebuds be your guide.

Lil Brew Hops at 209 Main Street tapas, share plates and mixology bar is located next door to its 'big sister' Hungry Brew Hops Public House & Eatery.

Enjoy modern décor, a piano bar with live music and a large wraparound patio overlooking Fairy Lake at Cachet Restaurant in downtown Newmarket at 500 Water Street .

Col. Mustard's Bar & Grill at 16925 Yonge Street, Great vibe, fun atmosphere, delicious food and Karaoke Fridays and Sunday.

ARTS & CULTURE

Newmarket Theatre hosts about 300 plays, musicals, seminars and workshops per year, and is looking for volunteers.



HISTORIC MAIN STREET

Take a walk into Newmarket history at the Elman W Campbell Museum in the heart of Main Street. Restored as the town's culture hub for theatre, music, dance arts and cultural activities, the Old Town Hall's Serpa Gallery offers a full schedule of shows, classes and programs for all ages. Market Square sits across the road as an open meeting place where local events are held.

A variety of Town programs are also held at the Newmarket Community Centre and Lions Hall, available for rent for private functions. Just outside is Riverwalk Commons, home to an outdoor stage, a water feature in summer and a skating rink and Ice Lounge in winter. In the adjacent established neighbourhood, the Public Library is a magnet for book lovers of all ages with fun programs including the popular Jane Austen book Club & more.

A thriving membership, excellent facilities, and a wide variety of activities, clubs, dances and entertainment, as well as day and extended trips on luxury coaches, ensure the Newmarket Seniors' Meeting Place is hopping all year round,

MAGNA CENTRE RECREATION CENTRE

There are a lot of reasons to head over to the Magna Centre, a state of the art recreation complex at 600 Mulock Drive. Featuring 4 arenas, 2 swimming pools, a fitness centre and studio, gymnasium, walking rack and 3 multi-purpose rooms, the new complex is Newmarket's largest. The fitness centre offers memberships, drop ins and personal training. The Men's Rec Hockey League also plays at the Magna Centre.

PARKS & TRAILS

Discover over 45 active parks and over 800 acres of parkland in Newmarket for picnics, hiking/ biking, soccer, baseball, playgrounds, tennis, basketball and more. Over 44 km of walking and biking trails link more than 20 km of trail from East Gwillimbury through to Aurora. The trails are lit, well maintained and sign posted, with separate areas for walking and biking or blading.
